### Desserts:

1) creating a music quiz game. The game stores a list of song names and their artist (e.g., the band or solo artist name). The player needs to try and guess the song name. The game is played as follows:

A random song name and artist are chosen.

The artist and the first letter of each word in the song title are displayed. The user has two chances to guess the name of the song.

If the user quesses the answer correctly the first time, they score 3 points. If the user guesses the answer correctly the second time, they score 1 point. The game repeats.

The game ends when a player guesses the song name incorrectly the second time.

Only authorised players are allowed to play the game.

### Starters:

- 1) Write an algorithm using pseudocode that calculates the amount of fuel a train will need to complete a journey. The algorithm must:
- a) ask the user how many kilometers the journey will be.
- b) only continue if the user enters a value greater than
- c) set the amount of fuel to a number 100 times greater than the number of kilometers.
- d) not allow the amount of fuel to be less than 1500 finally, display the amount of fuel needed.

#### Mains:

- 1) Design, develop, test and evaluate a system that:
- 1. Allows a player to enter their details, which are then authenticated to ensure that they are an authorised player.
- 2. Stores a list of song names and artists in an external file.
- 3. Selects a song from the file, displaying the artist and the first letter of each word of the sona title.
- 4. Allows the user up to two chances to guess the name of the song, stopping the game if they guess a song incorrectly on the second chance.
- 5. If the guess is correct, add the points to the player's score depending on the number of guesses.
- 6. Displays the number of points the player has when the game ends.
- 7. Stores the name of the player and their score in an external file.
- 8. Displays the score and player name of the top 5 winning scores from the external file

#### Of Mice and Men: Part b auestions

- In the rest of the novel, how does Steinbeck show that some people on the ranch are considered more important than others? How does this reflect the society in which the novel is set?
- In the rest of the novel how does Steinbeck use Crooks to present attitudes to black people at the time the novel is set?
- In the rest of the novel, how does Steinbeck present the lives of ranch workers at that time? -How do you think Steinbeck uses the character of Candy in the novel as a whole to convey important ideas about society at that time?

#### **An Inspector Calls**

- In the opening stage directions. Priestlev refers to Eric as 'not quite at ease, half shy, half assertive'. How does Priestley present these and other ideas about Eric in An Inspector Calls?

- Compare the methods poets use to present difficult relationships in 'The Farmer's Bride' (page 60) and in one other poem from Relationships.

#### **APPETIZERS**

Synthesis Sundae / £2.99

Create a mind-map on A3 paper of all the reasons why opposition to the Nazis was effective/wasn't. Begin by looking at each group pre/post-WWII and what they achieved. Next, try to think of ways they could have been more effective. Finally, create a memorial to the group that you think was the most effective.

#### Evaluation Eclairs / £9.99

Write a speech to persuade schools to transform the way they teach Black History. Use persuasive language and anecdotes involving historical figures you have researched to support your arguments. Go one step further and create a curriculum for all subjects that incorporates black history.

Evaluation Eton Mess / £9.99

Produce a brochure for a historical site in Britain that has changed over time. You could research Royal Heritage sites in Britain. Once you have researched, you need to judge why the site has changed over time. Look at all periods and how it has transformed in purpose.




